MEMBERSHIP DUES:

Active: \$50.00 for the 2023 season. Dues are payable on or before the Annual Spring Meeting of each year. (Article 4)

MAINTENANCE OF HANDICAP AND SCORE CARDS

1. All score cards must show the event, date and signatures. **Please indicate the specific competition.** You will note that more than one event is scheduled in several instances.
2. Where handicaps are applicable in specific competitions, please indicate your current handicap on the score cards. Failure to comply with this directive will result in the player being disqualified in the competition.
3. All adjusted scores are to be entered into the computer, not only for games played on our own course but also for those played on other rated courses, except those scores obtained while course is not active. Scores made by a player at any golf course in an area observing an active season **must** be posted for handicap purposes, i.e.: If a member from our club plays in Arizona in January, her scores are acceptable and shall be returned and entered prior to commencing play here. Source : R.C.G.A. Handicap Systems Manual Section 6. These scores must be adjusted to R.C.G.A. equitable stroke control prior to posting.
4. Equitable stroke guidelines are available at <https://www.golfcanada.ca/handicapping/>
5. If at least 13 holes of an 18-hole round are played, the remaining five holes, for handicap purposes, shall be recorded as par plus any handicap strokes the player is entitled to receive on the five holes. If at least 7 holes of a 9-hole round are played, the remaining two holes, for handicap purposes, shall be recorded as par plus any handicap strokes the player is entitled to receive on the two holes.
6. You alone are responsible for your handicap being kept up to date. Please feel free to contact one of the officers from your section if you require assistance.
7. Extra Day Cards: These scores are used for handicap purposes only. Once you have entered your adjusted score in the computer it is not necessary to turn the score card in.

REQUIREMENTS, ELIGIBILITY AND EXCEPTIONS FOR CLUB COMPETITIONS

On Monday, a minimum of eight (8) golfers must complete their game for it to be a qualifying competition.

Three (3) games to be played within the scheduled season, Monday or Wednesday, to be eligible for the Club Championship and the competitions,

No Exclusions.

LAW 1: No matter how bad your last shot was, the worst is yet to come. This law does not expire on the 18th hole, since it has the supernatural tendency to extend over the course of a tournament, a summer and, eventually, a lifetime.

CLUB COMPETITIONS

18 HOLE SECTION

1. **BIRDIE BOARD**
Post your **Birdie** on the “**Birdie Board**” and have it witnessed.
This is in effect during the scheduled season on regular draw days.
2. **CHIP-IN BOARD**
Chip-ins must occur during the scheduled season on regular draw days. In the event of a tie—the winner will be determined by retrogression (in other words who ever has the most chip-ins first).
3. **RINGER BOARD (MOST IMPROVED GOLFER)**
Your first 18 holes score on a normal draw day will be posted on the ringer board by the captain, in pen. During the season on any draw day if you have improved on any score, across the first score out and record the improved score in pencil so it can be adjusted further. Check the board each draw day with another member. Winner will be the low net score at the end of the season.
4. **PUTTING COMPETITION**
Lowest aggregate of total putts in three out of five rounds.
5. **HOLE-IN-ONE OR EAGLE BOARD**
Post your **Hole-in-one or Eagle** on the “**Hole-in-one or Eagle Board**” and have it witnessed. This is in effect for all rounds played on the Regina Beach Golf Course.
6. **TRILOGY**
Teams consist of at least one 9-hole member and one 18 hole Member along with any 2 other members. Format to be Announced. Social to follow.
7. **ECLECTIC**
Stroke Play—Low Net. Played on two Mondays.
The best score for each hole with full handicap is used.
8. **FORSTER LOW NET COMPETITION**
18 Hole Medal Round—lowest aggregate of three net scored out of five rounds.

CLUB COMPETITIONS

9 HOLE SECTION

1. **BUTLER PUTTING COMPETITION**
Lowest aggregate of total putts in three out of five rounds.
2. **RINGER BOARD (MOST IMPROVED GOLFER)**
Your first 9-hole score on a normal draw day will be posted on the ringer board by the captain, in pen. During the season on any **draw day** if you have improved on any score, cross the first score out and record the improved score in **pencil** so, it can be adjusted further. Check the board each draw day with another member. Winner will be the **low net score** at the end of the season.
3. **TRILOGY**
Teams consist of at least one 9-hole member and one 18 hole member along with any 2 other members. Format to be announced. Social to follow.
4. **Barber-Hammond**
Note: Former winners are not eligible to win. Lowest Aggregate of three out of five net scores.
5. **CHIP-IN BOARD**
Chip-ins must occur during the scheduled season on Regular draw days played on the Regina Beach Golf Course. Post on the “Chip-in Board” and have it witnessed.
6. **BIRDIE BOARD (Birdie Pin Awarded)**
Post your “Birdie” on the “Birdie Board” and have it witnessed. This is in effect during the scheduled season on regular Draw Days.

GUESTS

Guests will be allowed on regular draw days based on the following criteria:

1. The member bringing the guest must notify the captain no later than the day before.
2. There will be a limit of two (2) guests per section each draw day.
3. Exceptions will be subject to the discretion of the captain.

RULES OF READY GOLF

To assist you in keeping up with the group in front of you, please follow the READY GOLF RULES outlined below:

ON THE TEE

1. The player who is ready should hit.
2. Shorter hitters should hit first.
3. Tee off as soon as the group ahead is clear.
4. Carry an extra ball in your pocket.
5. If there is a clear hole ahead, you must allow faster players to play through.

ON THE FAIRWAY

6. HIT WHEN READY AND SAFE; do not use honor system.
7. Take appropriate clubs to your ball and HIT WITHOUT DELAY.
8. Have your group watch where each shot goes.
9. Limit search for lost balls to 3 minutes.

ON THE GREEN

10. Place your clubs between green and next tee.
11. Study your putt while others are putting.
12. Continue putting until holed out.
13. Leave the green IMMEDIATELY after holing out and PROCEED to the next tee. Complete your scorecard after you are off the green.

ON PAR 3 GREENS

14. Upon reaching the green, if the group in front of you is waiting to hit on the next tee, stand in a safe area and have the group behind you hit.

SHORT CUTS

15. Mark your score on the way to the next tee.
16. When driving a cart, drop your partner at her ball, then continue to yours.

**Remember, slow play affects everyone.
Please cooperate for the enjoyment of all.**

(Established September 3, 1966)

BYLAWS

This document covers the general bylaws of The Regina Beach Ladies Golf Club Inc. which regulate the transaction of business and the affairs of this organization.

ARTICLE 1:

NAME:

This organization shall be known as "The Regina Beach Ladies Golf Club Inc." hereinafter referred to as the "Club." This organization is incorporated In Saskatchewan under the *Non-Profit Corporation Act, 1995*, effective June 28, 2005.

ARTICLE 2:

AFFILIATION:

The Club shall be affiliated with Golf Canada and Golf Saskatchewan.

ARTICLES 3:

OBJECTIVES

- 3.1 To promote good fellowship among its members.
- 3.2 To promote the game of golf as a competitive and recreational activity.
- 3.3 Maintain the National System of Handicapping as established by Golf Canada for all members who so desire.
- 3.4 Adhere to the Rules of Golf as established by the Golf Canada and to local rules defined by the Rules Committee.
- 3.5 To liaise with Golf Canada, Golf Saskatchewan and the Regina Beach Golf Club.

ARTICLES 4:

MEMBERSHIP DUES

Shall be established at the Annual Fall Meeting of the Club, and shall be payable on or before the Annual Spring Meeting of each year.

ARTICLE 5:

MEMBERSHIP

5.1 MEMBERS

5.1.1 A playing member is one who plays regularly in the weekly draws. Playing members hold Gold Membership Status with Golf Saskatchewan via payment of fees by the Regina Beach Ladies Golf Club.

5.1.2 A Non-Playing member is one who supports the objectives of the Club but does not golf in the weekly draws.

5.2 RESIGNATION AND TERMINATION

Any member may resign by filling a written resignation with the secretary. Resignation shall not relieve a member of unpaid dues, or other charges previously accrued.

Failure by a member to pay dues as set by the Board of Directors at the Fall Meeting which are due and payable on or before the Spring Meeting, will be terminated as a member until such dues are paid.

5.3 DISCIPLINE

Any individual whose conduct shall be deemed detrimental to the best interests of golf, or the Club may be removed from membership by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. However, such individual shall not be removed without due notice and an opportunity to be heard in their own defense.

ARTICLE 6:

GOVERNANCE

6.1 GOVERNING BODY

The operations of the organization shall be governed by an elected Board of Directors consisting of Executive Committee Members and Board Members. The functions of the Executive Committee are the management of the immediate business operations and strategic direction in between Board Meetings as well as any specific duties identified within these Bylaws.

6.2 THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEMBERS SHALL BE:

- 6.2.1 Past President
- 6.2.2 President
- 6.2.3 Vice President
- 6.2.4 Secretary
- 6.2.5 Treasurer

6.3 THE BOARD MEMBERS SHALL BE:

- 6.3.1 Captain—18 Hole Section
- 6.3.2 Co-Captain—18 Hole Section
- 6.3.3 Captain—9 Hole Section
- 6.3.4 Co-Captain—9 Hole Section
- 6.3.5 Handicap Coordinator (for both 18 Hole and 9 Hole Sections)
- 6.3.6 Membership Coordinator
- 6.3.7 Junior Development Coordinator
- 6.3.8 Social Coordinators

6.4 COMMITTEES AND APPOINTED COORDINATORS

The Executive Committee may appoint committees or coordinators, either standing or ad hoc, in order to effectively and efficiently further the stated purposes of the organization. The establishment of any committee must first receive the approval of the Board by way of a majority vote. The reporting format for such Appointed Committees and Coordinators will be determined at the time they are established. Examples of past Appointed Coordinators are the Invitational Coordinator and the Handbook Coordinator.

6.5 COMPENSATION OR REMUNERATION

The Board of Directors shall not receive compensation or remuneration.

ARTICLE 7: TERMS OF OFFICE

7.1 UNEXPIRED TERM OF OFFICE:

The Executive Committee shall have the authority to appoint a replacement to fill any vacancies on the Board of Directors for the remainder of the current term.

7.2 REMOVAL

Any member of the Board of Directors may be removed for cause by a majority vote of the Executive Committee. Cause includes but may not be restricted to: disclosing confidential or sensitive information, using the position for personal gain, illegal activities and inappropriate behavior or disrespecting other members of the Board of Directors.

Any elected officer or director who is absent for two consecutive meetings may be removed from the seat by the Executive Committee, upon recommendation of the President and following discussion between President and that individual Board member. The Secretary shall record such events in the minutes of the Board meeting.

ARTICLE 8: DUTIES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

8.1 Past President

Shall remain a member of the Executive for a period of one year and shall render assistance to other Board members when required.

8.2 President

Shall preside at all General, Special Executive and Annual Meetings of the Club and is an ex-officio member of all committees. In her absence, the Vice-President shall chair the meeting.

8.3 Vice-President

Shall chair any meetings in the absence of the President and, on the request of the President, shall give assistance to other members of the Board of Directors. This position liaises with Golf Saskatchewan with respect to any grants that may be available, organizes ladies golf lessons and also leads the annual Nominating Committee. This position is the automatic, elected successor to the President position.

8.4 Secretary

Shall take minutes of all meetings and distribute accordingly; shall maintain and ensure the effective management of all records of the Club; shall issue notices of meetings when required and shall attend to all correspondence.

8.5 Treasurer

Shall be responsible for maintaining and ensuring the effective management of all financial records of the Club. This includes but is not limited to collection of membership dues, recording receipts and expenditures, reporting on finances at the Board Meetings, and presenting the financial statements at the Annual Spring Meeting of the Club. This position also liaises with the Information Services Corporation and provides up to date listing of the Board of Directors to Golf Saskatchewan.

8.6 Captain (Both Sections)

Shall be responsible to draw up a fixture card as soon as possible in the spring; make draws; act as a coordinator for the various annual events; post and/or share standings of competitions; and be responsible for securing prizes and donations.

8.7 Co-Captain (Both Sections)

Shall assist the captain in the duties noted above.

8.8 Handicap Coordinator

Shall be responsible for periodically checking all computer entries to manage the correct recordings of handicaps; shall maintain a permanent handicap log for all members; and shall render assistance to Playing Members on request regarding handicapping.

8.9 Membership Coordinator

Shall be responsible to recommend the annual membership dues, accept payment of membership dues and maintain the Membership List.

8.10 Junior Development Coordinator

Shall be responsible for promoting Junior Golf by encouraging and developing Junior Golfers. This may include but will not be limited to organizing junior golf lessons and liaising with the Regina Beach Golf Club with respect to such.

8.11 Social Coordinator(s)

Shall be responsible for social events sponsored by the Club, including but not limited to the Spring and Fall General Meetings. Shall appoint a committee from the membership at large to assist with social events.

ARTICLE 9:

ELECTIONS:

9.1 A Nominating Committee, made up of three (3) persons consisting of the Past President, Vice President, and one Member-at-Large and chaired by the Vice President.

9.2 Election of Officers shall be conducted at the Annual Fall Meeting. Term of Office for each position shall be one year

9.3 Incumbents of any office may be re-elected to a further term

9.4 The incumbents of the positions of Vice-President (President Elect) and Co-Captain (both sections) shall automatically become President and Captain respectively if it is their wish to assume such duties and responsibilities.

ARTICLE 10:

SIGNING OFFICERS:

There shall be three (3) designated signing officers determined annually. The signing officers shall be the Treasurer and any two (2) of the following: President, Vice President, Past President or Secretary. Notwithstanding the forgoing, at least two (2) of the signing officers shall be a resident of the same community and shall not be immediate relatives.

ARTICLE 11:

RULES COMMITTEE

11.1 A Rules Committee shall be established on the following basis: President, Captain (18 Hole Section), Captain (9 Hole Section), and two (2) Members-at-Large. (Note: Co-Captains of Both Sections may attend meetings as observers.)

11.2 The duties and responsibilities of this committee shall be to resolve differences in regard to specific rules and consider and establish local rules for the Club. This should be done in liaison with the Regina Beach Men's Golf Club and the Regina Beach Golf Club.

ARTICLE 12:

MEETINGS:

12.1 GENERAL MEETINGS:

12.1.1 There shall be two (2) general meetings held each year, namely the Spring and Fall Meetings.

12.1.2 Other general or special meetings may be held during the year at the call of the President, or upon request of a least ten (10) Playing Members.

12.2 BOARD OF DIRECTOR MEETINGS

Meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at the call of the President and occur a minimum of four (4) times a year. Fifty percent (50%) plus one (1) of the number of Board members shall constitute a quorum.

12.3 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Are held at the call of the President as required.

12.4 QUORUM

For General and Special Meeting quorum constitutes the majority of members present. A majority of Board member positions or Executive Committee member positions respectively, shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of transacting the business of the organization. Board Meetings or Executive Committee Meetings may be conducted telephonically and/or virtually so long as all persons participating shall be able to hear each other. Telephonic participation shall constitute presence in person at any such meeting.

ARTICLE 13:

REVIEW OF FINANCIAL RECORDS

A reviewer will be appointed each year at the Annual Fall Meeting. Financial Records to be reviewed as soon as possible after fiscal year end.

ARTICLE 14:

FISCAL YEAR:

Shall be February 1 to January 31.

ARTICLE 15:

GIFTS, CONTRIBUTIONS AND WELFARE:

Shall be at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE 16:

DISSOLUTION

In the event of the dissolution or final liquidation of the Club, its remaining net assets will be distributed to a local Regina Beach organization, as voted on at a General Membership Meeting, for use consistent with its purpose and objectives, thus no part of such net assets may inure to the benefit of any individual member or person.

ARTICLE 17:

AMENDMENTS TO THE BYLAWS:

This Bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote at either the Annual Spring or Fall Meeting. Proposed changes must be submitted in writing to the Secretary of the Club not later than thirty (30) days prior to either the Annual Spring or Fall Meeting where the vote will take place. Amendments take place immediately upon adoption.

Amendments passed at the Annual Meetings in 1985, 1987, 1992, 1993, 1994, 1996, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2020, respectively.
